Yesterday was my first visit to Pine Tree in Annapolis, Maryland. I've been to several other resorts but I had heard great things about this place--and wasn't disappointed!

I arrived and checked in at the office. They require a tour for first time visits, so I waited for my tour guide. It was really chilly and we didn't undress for the tour. I got to see the camping area and the cabins. Later in the evening, I got to visit a friend in his cabin that he was renting and the inside was amazing. Cozy, clean, and comfy! I usually like tent camping, but I definitely want to try renting one of their cabins.

Next, we wandered over to the main hub of activity, a building that housed a large area for activities, an indoor pool, plus a downstairs rec room that was full of amenities. There was also a hot tub outside, but it was being worked on while I was there so I didn't get to try it. We also checked out the nearby cafe. After the tour was over, I was hungry!

I changed into my robe back at my car and walked back to the cafe. I'm vegan, so eating out is sometimes...challenging. They had a delicious vegan burger however, so I was super happy :) The buns are made in-house (super fresh and tasty!), and the veggies were fresh and crisp. The food that everyone else had looked equally amazing.

After a great meal, I went down to the rec room so I could shower before getting into the pool. I prefer a more open shower room versus small stalls (feels less claustrophobic), and their five shower head room did not disappoint. Everything was clean, all the soap dispensers were full of soap, and I was able to quickly clean off and go for a swim in the indoor pool. The pool was delightfully warm, and I got to chat with a bunch of great people. Everyone was so nice and welcoming! After a great swim, I decided to return to the rec room to rinse off again and enjoy the sauna.

The rec room was a nice social area. It housed the laundry area, a bookshelf stocked with books, lots of games, sofas and tables, bathrooms, the sauna, the showers, a pool table, and a very nice gym. The sauna was empty when I got there, so I sat and enjoyed the heat until the 15 minute timer was up. It was convenient to have the showers right next door so I could do a cool rinse after the sauna. I decided to go swimming again after this! I originally had planned to go on the trails, but my flip flops were rubbing my feet so I decided to wait until I had more appropriate footwear.

There was a small social in the big event room next to the pool, so I went to that too. A good number of people showed up and we enjoyed snacks and drinks. A recurring theme here was that everyone was amazingly friendly; none of the other places I've been made me feel quite as at-home as Pine Tree's residents did. I also really enjoyed learning how this resort fosters a sense of community, with members regularly volunteering to do projects, maintenance, and host events as part of the co-op membership.

Later in the evening I had to head home, but I was thoroughly pleased with my visit and I can't wait to return! I also don't think I need the rest of my trial visits to decide if I want to become a member ;) I thought this place seemed a lot better maintained and a lot more "modern" than most of the resorts I've visited. It seems like they really take care of the place and make upgrading/maintaining the property a priority. If you're anywhere near Maryland, I 100% recommend giving Pine Tree a try!
